Notes: At the AGM outgoing Chair (Jane Webster) encouraged us to make a submission on this. I am writing to you to ask that you please forward this submission as appropriate.

At the NZCF 2018 AGM General Remit 8.1G was passed (with amendment).

There was some discussion surrounding various parts of that remit, of which one topic was relating to the frequency of vaccinations.

There was some general dissatisfaction that the following wording surrounding the requirements of vaccinations was left in the remit:
"(within the preceding 12 months)"

The reason for this discussion is because the current vaccination protocols recommend vaccinations every 2 or 3 years (depending on the situation).
I'd invite and encourage the NZCF to research this, before making any sort of decision.

There was also a point made that the wording "vet's certificate" could be misleading as this may be interpreted as a certificate of endorsement as to the cat's health.

At the AGM outgoing Chair (Jane Webster) encouraged us to make a submission on this.

I ask that the NZCF considers rewording new rule 17.6A as follows:

17.6A Where an ex-breeding cat is sold or gifted for rehoming, the cat: a. shall have a current vaccination against Panleukopenia, Rhinotracheitis and Calicivirus, and the vaccination records shall be provided by the breeder at the time of delivery of the cat; b. shall not be showing signs of illness which may be considered infectious or contagious; and c. females will be desexed prior to rehoming and males will desexed with a stand down period of 6 weeks.

Note: change to the wording in part a) only.
No change to b) or c).

Dear Chris,

I am once again writing to request a name change for the Australian Bombay

The word "Australian" needs to be removed, and preferably as soon as possible.

My reasons for this are as follows:

- the word "Australian" was only added as a differentiator after the importation of three (American) Bombays via Australia, a few years after I started my breeding programme.

I might add that this occurred after one Breeder was set up by some others to undermine my programme. I could but will not name the people involved in this. The three (American) Bombays never produced any kittens, one was shown at only one Show, and they have not existed here for many years now.

- I am at this stage the only person in New Zealand breeding Bombays (as originally called). There is another Breeder who is and will be out of action for some time due to illness, plus another who has not commenced breeding the Bombays. Both of these people are in fact also members of Catz Inc.
- I have consistently and successfully been showing my cats and kittens for at least 15 years.

Also, as of last year, others have been very successfully showing progeny from my cats, throughout New Zealand

- I have exported kittens to Australia, Japan and Hong Kong, and sent many throughout New Zealand - all referred to as Bombays.
- comments from TICA and CFA Judges have been consistently positive and encouraging in terms of the Bombay Breed type, especially the conformation and eye colour.
- Judges from Australian States (other than Queensland) have also been extremely positive and constructive, and in fact those who are Tutor Judges in

their own country have stated that they would have been honoured to have had my kittens for their teaching sessions.

- Judges from Queensland on the other hand (for personal and political reasons about which I am well aware), whilst positive in their comments, have prefaced every judging with - "well of course we don't call them Australian Bombays any longer" - very tiring I might add.
- Judges from New Zealand on the other hand are, and have been for some years now, happily calling them Bombays
- All of my kittens are desexed (except those sold for breeding), microchipped (and registered on the NZ Companion Animal Register), and insured before leaving home, and in each case when that paperwork is done they are stated as being Bombays.
- given that the American Bombay has not existed in New Zealand for more than a decade, there is absolutely no reason for the use of the word "Australian" as a differentiator.
- the standard could easily be changed by dropping "Australian" and then merging the two that exist at present - thereby allowing for the slight variations that currently exist - especially in head type. After all - the Burmese Standard allows for variation in head type.
- I have been breeding these Bombays since 2000 and always struggled with the imposed word "Australian" given how it came to be.

It is now 2018 and this issue needs to be resolved. I have discussed this with both Australian and New Zealand Judges - their thinking is the same. Also, in common day, all of my pet owners and other Breeders and NZCF Inc members happily refer to them as Bombays. As do the prospective new Breeders.

I had also discussed this matter with Jane Webster and stated that I would be more than happy to work on a common Breed Standard.

Of interest is the fact that in the NZCF Inc Breed Code Standards, both Standards start off with - "The Bombay is"

As I said, I would like this addressed under urgency as soon as possible, and needless to say, I would be happy to discuss this further.

Submission to the New Zealand Cat Fancy Executive Council Attachment

At the 2018 Annual General Meeting of the New Zealand Cat Fancy the Palmerston North Cat Club submitted the Remit below which was felt to be necessary after the anomaly which occurred in the Longhair Entire Cat section of the NZCF Annual Awards 2017.

Throughout the 2017 show season, two cats were regular winners of Best In Show and Runner-Up to Best In Show at the National Show and at All Breeds shows throughout the North Island but ended the year as second and third placed cats in the Longhair Entire Cat section of the 2017 Annual Awards. Cat Of the Year in that section was awarded to a cat which had accrued the majority (5/7) of his points at a Specialist breed show in a very large entry which was helped by the owner of the winning cat having entered 11 of the 31 cats entered in that section and a total of 19 cats in the show. It should be noted that the two cats mentioned above as having won second and third place respectively in the COTY Annual Awards both beat the Cat Of The Year winner four out of the five times that the three cats competed against each other but, of course, the two were ineligible to enter the show at which that cat did most of its winning. For this reason, we believe that the 2017 Cat Of The Year result does not accurately represent a true reflection of the top winning cats across all breeds for that year. We therefore request that the NZCF EC give further consideration to the Palmerston North Cat Club Remit to the 2018 AGM and adopt the allocation of points as suggested in that Remit or develop some other system of points allocation for the NZCF Annual Awards that more accurately reflects those cats which are the best across all breeds.

Remit to NZCF Annual General Meeting 2018

Show By Laws: Appendix D. NZCF Annual Awards Scheme

“That Show Bylaw Appendix D is amended by adding the underlined wording to D.3

D.3. A set number of ring results are used in the calculations, and that number is decided by the Executive Council from time to time. The best point scores from the set number of rings during the show season will be used to calculate placings in the NZCF Annual Awards at the end of the year. The total number of points are added together from the best placings, i.e., only the best scores from the set number of ring results will be used even if a cat has additional top ten placings.

Add: Except that no more than 3 ring results (or half the total number of ring results as decided by the Executive Council should they decide on an even number of ring results to be used to decide Annual Awards) obtained in a Single Breed ring may be used by any cat.

Rationale: The New Zealand Cat Fancy Annual Awards should reflect the best cats or kittens across all breeds. Under the current system, if a cat does exceptionally well in a large number of well-supported single breed rings, it is possible for it to feature highly in the NZCF Annual Awards without ever winning over cats in any but its own breed. This gives an advantage to that cat because cats of other breeds are ineligible to enter that single breed ring which means that the current Annual Awards Scheme does not provide a level playing field for all Breeds of Cats. It is also common for such Single Breed rings to be extremely well supported by both breeders and pet owners so Entry Numbers are often boosted by cats which are not necessarily competitive but which give a points advantage to the cats that are.

For your information, in the Dogs New Zealand Top Twenty Competition, points are awarded as follows: Best In Show, All Breeds – 20 points.

Reserve Best In Show, All Breeds – 7 points

Best of Group – 2 points

(A “Group” refers to a group of dogs bred for a specific purpose i.e. Gundogs, Hounds etc and consists of 10, 20 or more breeds.)

There are no points allocated for Specialist breed shows and a lot of those are held throughout the year with Breed Specialist judges officiating.

JUDGES

Training & Curriculum

That EC consider the following changes to policy and the manual:

1. All new applicants for judges training should be trained as All Breeds Judges. (Note: After passing either the LH or the SH component of the course (whichever is completed first) students may placed on the relevant Junior Panel progressing to the Intermediate Judging Panel as detailed in the Judges Manual. However, until the second component is completed, they may not proceed to the Senior Panel)

2.The curriculum be updated:

a.To include more practice-based training (e.g., face-to-face and hands on training) and media oriented (e.g., Power Point, annotated photo essays).

b.To use keyword/phrase charts and comparison charts to replace, at least in part, the essay component.

Note: It is suggested that EC consider updating the Judges Manual to reflect these and any other amendments

Tutor Judges & Judges Guild

1.That EC revert to the practice of appointing several Tutor Judges in each major area (Upper and Lower North Island and South Island). Tutors will assist the

Judges Portfolio Manager as required, and facilitate Handling, Stewarding and Judging Schools and Refresher Seminars in each area (Note: with a more 'hands-on' approach envisaged for schools the burden should not be placed on just one or two persons)

2. That EC encourage the formation of a Judges Guild (or similar), with chapters in each 'region'. (Note: Judges should be seen as experts within, and need to be more proactive in the Fancy. A guild would serve as a vehicle to gain as well as collect and disseminate knowledge, especially in an advisory capacity)

STANDARDS OF POINTS

That the EC consider the following:

1. A glossary consisting of line drawings/diagrams, relative to each breed, be included in the Standard of Points. This would serve a two-fold purpose: They could be used as a visual reference (and teaching resource) for judges and exhibitors, and breeders, who don't care to exhibit can keep a check on the type etc of their stock that they are selling for showing (Please see separate email with examples)

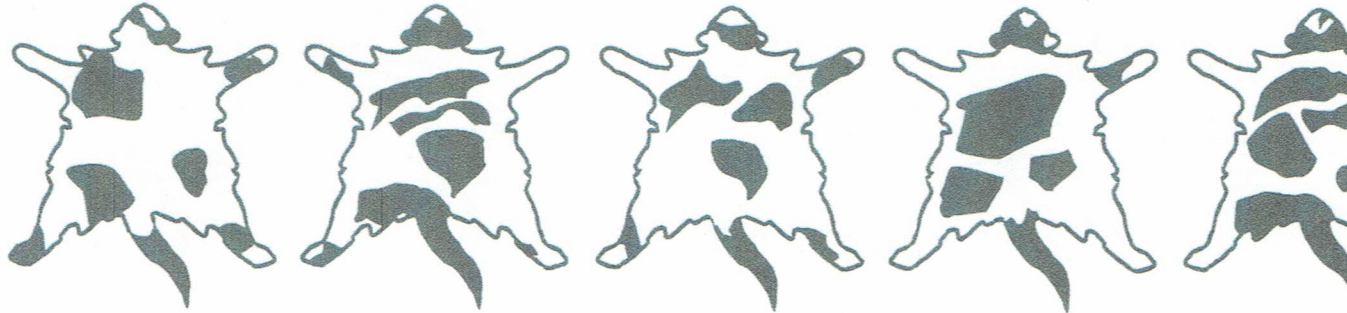
2. Every standard to have a preamble which includes the essential characteristics of the breed (Note: these are already included in some standards, e.g., the Burmese Standard states that "The Burmese is an elegant cat of medium foreign type, which is ...".)

WORKFORCE & SUBCOMMITTEES

Investigation or development of the above submissions could be done by the EC creating short-term sub-committee(s), staffed by volunteers or appointees including (but not limited to) judges, governance documents officer, standards of points officer, as applicable.

These sub-committees would be issued with a project outline, be required to meet interim and final reporting targets, and discuss, develop, consult, and produce working documents to be referred back to the appropriate Portfolio Managers for inclusion on future EC agenda(s).

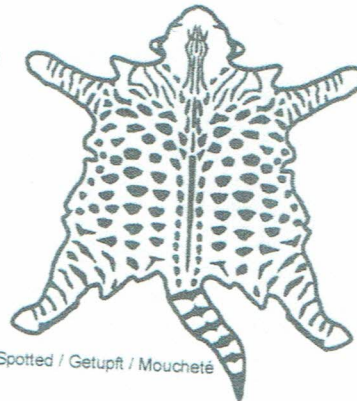

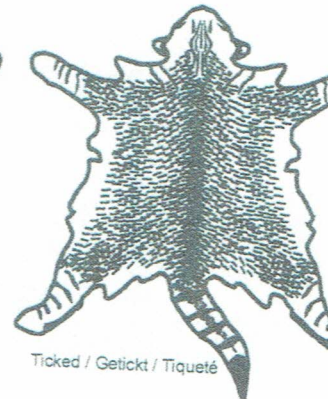

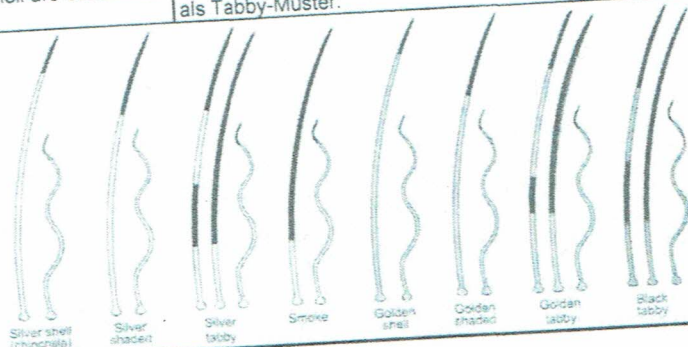

Coat Patterns

Point Colors

Body color: should be off-white, any shading relative to the point color; overall body color should be in marked contrast to the points.

Eye color: blue.

Mink Colors

Body color: should be a rich, even, unmarked color, shading almost imperceptibly to a slightly lighter hue on the underparts. There must be a distinct contrast between body color and points.

Eye color: aqua.

Solid Colors

Body color: may be a slight lighter shade of the point color, very little contrast with points.

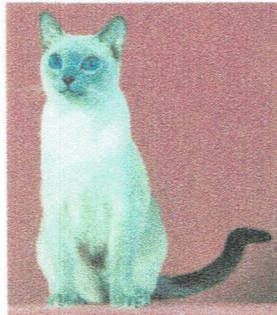
Eye color: green to yellow/green.

Points: slate blue.

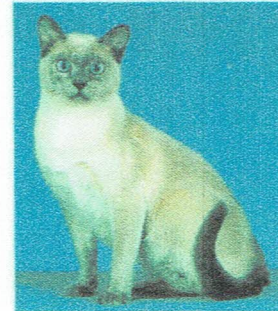
Nose leather: blue-gray.

Paw pads: blue-gray (may have a rosy undertone).

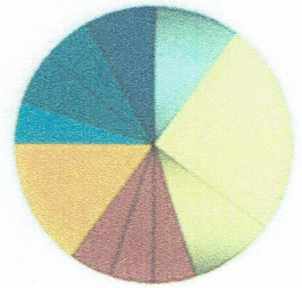

GENERAL: the ideal Tonkinese is intermediate in type, neither cobby nor svelte. The Tonkinese should give the overall impression of an alert, active cat with good muscular development. The cat should be surprisingly heavy. While the breed is considered medium in size, balance and proportion are of greater importance.

HEAD AND MUZZLE: the head is a modified slightly rounded wedge somewhat longer than it is wide, with high gently planed cheekbones. The muzzle is blunt, as long as it is wide. There is a slight whisker break, gently curved, following the lines of the wedge. There is a slight stop at eye level. In profile the tip of the chin lines with the tip of the nose in the same vertical plane. There is a gentle rise from the tip of the nose to the stop. There is a gentle contour with a slight rise from the nose stop to the forehead. There is a slight convex curve to the forehead.

EARS: alert, medium in size. Oval tips, broad at the base. Ears set as much on the sides of the head as on the top. Hair on the ears very short and close-lying. Leather may show through.

EYES: open almond shape. Slanted along the cheekbones toward the outer edge of the ear. Eyes are proportionate in size to the face.

EYE COLOR: depth, clarity, and brilliance of color preferred. Best seen in natural light.

BODY: torso medium in length, demonstrating well-developed muscular strength without coarseness. The Tonkinese conformation strikes a midpoint between the extremes of long, svelte body types and cobby, compact body types. Balance and proportion are more important than size alone. The abdomen should be taut, well-muscled, and firm.

LEGS and FEET: fairly slim, proportionate in length and bone to the body. Hind legs slightly longer than front. Paws more oval than round. Trim. Toes: five in front and four behind.

TAIL: proportionate in length to body. Tapering.

COAT: medium short in length, close-lying, fine, soft and silky, with a lustrous sheen.

BODY COLOR: allowance to be made for lighter body color in young cats, and for less contrast in older cats. With the dilute colors in particular, development of full body color may take up to 16 months. Cats do darken with age.

POINT COLOR: mask, ears, feet, and tail all densely marked, but merging gently into body color. Except in kittens, mask and ears should be connected by tracings. Nose leather color should correspond to the intensity of the point color. There will be more contrast between points and body color for the Champagne and Platinum than for the Natural and Blue.

PENALIZE: extreme ranginess or cobbiness. Definite nose break. Round eyes.
