Cages – club supply:

Our larger crates measure 76cm (w) x 54cm (d) x 62cm (h). These will be predominantly used for the larger breeds - Maine Coon, Siberian etc.

Our middle size wire show crates measure 61cm (w) x 46cm (d) x 54cm (h). These will be used for the majority of show exhibits.

We have kept a small number of good quality wooden crates just in case. IF these are needed, they will be for kittens. These measure 45cm x 45cm.

Our new crates **do not** have solid sides so Curtains are a must. If you do not have curtains, we can give you a contact or two for purchasing curtains. Please talk to the secretary soonest if you need this information. We do have lightweight corflute for between exhibits.

Cages – own supply:

If you wish to bring your own show cage, we ask please that you notify the club with the width across the front so that we can allocate sufficient space. You can write this on your show entry form please. Cages must be wire and no larger than 76cm so as to be in keeping with the rest of the show.

Please note: Only exhibitor's name and city (and prefix for breeders) will be printed in the Show Catalogue.

Veterinary Inspection:

As per Shows Bylaw 8.6 – 8.13:

Cats may be ultra violet lamped. Vaccination certificates must be produced **for all exhibits.** Kitten vaccinations must be at least 7 days old; adults should have had at least one vaccination in the last three years.

Please note No exhibitors to leave the hall area until all exhibits have been cleared by the vets.

Type

In classes 111 - 171 Longhair breed/type exhibits compete against all other Longhair breed/type exhibits; Shorthair breed/type exhibits compete against all other Shorthair breed/type exhibits. Judging takes into account only the shape/type of the exhibit, not coat condition or eye colour.

Breeder's Award of Merit:

This award is made at the discretion of the Judge for the exhibit which in his/her opinion is most worthy of the award. The certificate shall be sent to the **BREEDER** of the exhibit. There is no class number, entry fee or prize money.

DOMESTICS and COMPANIONS:

All Domestics and Companions will be entered automatically into relevant classes. Also if kitten or cat is owned by a child – please advise on your entry form to be eligible for awards. Also please advise if the cat/kitten has come from a recognized rescue organization.

Companion and Domestic Cat Coat Definitions

Longhair has a coat of **MORE** than 3 cm long (approx 1 inch) and stands out from its body when brushed forwards. Hair on tail may stand out like a plume.

Shorthair is not easily brushed forward, may be flat and sleek or dense but not flowing.

Companion and Domestic Cats Entry Eligibility

- 1. All Companion cats and kittens <u>must</u> be desexed (neutered or spayed)
- 2. All Domestic cats and kittens must be desexed (neutered or spayed)
- 3. All Kittens must hold a current vaccination certificate with the most recent vaccination being dated at least seven (7) days prior to the show. Please ensure you have your current vaccination certificate with you.
- 4. Exhibits entering the Companion Cats Section must meet the criteria of Rule 6a of the NZCF Registered Companion Cats Section

(6a – As this division is intended as a division to enable pedigree, part pedigree, or pedigree phenotype cats to be shown specifically separate from unregistered Domestic exhibits, no cat <u>without prior dispensation</u> <u>from the Executive Council</u> which has been awarded Grand Champion or higher in either Entire or Neuter/Spey Divisions will be permitted to be shown as Registered Companion Cats).

Junior Demonstration

We will be running a small demonstration for junior exhibitors who want to show their desexed kitten/cat. Juniors under 16 year of age can enter. All juniors' cats will be judged together, whether pedigree, domestic or companions. Please see the Junior entry form for more information. Limited to 10 entries.

CHALLENGE CERTIFICATES

The Honours Registrar will advise when a cat qualifies as a Champion or Premier, so there is no need to issue certificates on the day. All adult Cats are now eligible for Challenge Certificates.

DEFINITION OF TERMS USED

CAT	Feline of 9 months of age or older on show day
JUNIOR CAT:	Feline under the age of two years on show day
INTERMEDIATE CAT	Feline 2 years but under the age of 5 years on show day
SENIOR CAT	Cat 5 years but under the age of 7 on show day
VETERAN CAT	Cat 7 years and older on show day
KITTEN	A kitten less than 9 months of age on show day
OPEN KITTEN	Where kittens 4 months and over but less than 9 months
KITTEN 4-6 MTHS	of age on show day compete against each other Kittens 4 months and over but less than 6 months on show day
KITTEN 6-9 MTHS	Kittens 6 months and over but less than 9 months on show day
NZ BRED	Exhibits born in New Zealand (Overseas Imports cannot be entered)
MONTH	One calendar month
OWNER	The person or persons listed in the NZCF registers as owning the cat.

Exhibitors:

You are responsible for entering your exhibits in the correct classes. Please indicate what class and rings your cat / kitten are to be entered in, eg: If it's entered in all rings please state this etc... It's not up to us to assume that they have been entered we only follow your instructions. If you are unsure of how to fill out your entry forms please contact your entry clerks or secretary for confirmation.

Early Departure from Show:

If you wish to depart the show earlier that the scheduled time of closing (in accordance with show bylaw 10.8) you will need to fill in the form attached at the end of this document and have this in the hands of the Show Manager (copy to show secretary). Emergency departures will be handled as necessary.

** Reclassification of Cats/Kittens at Show – <u>New Information</u>**

If during the show concern is raised that your kitten has been registered incorrectly, under the NZCF's Registration Rules your kitten can be reclassified on show day with the agreement of three judges. Show Secretary has the necessary forms.

Help on Show Day:

If you are able to offer you help on show day as a handler, steward, or scribe please indicate on your entry form and you will be contacted prior to the show. Morning Tea and Lunch will be provided for those working in official capacities.

Prizes:

It is the decision of the Hamilton Cat Club to distribute prizes won at the time of the Top Ten's being announced. Exhibitors will be responsible for putting their prizes away safely after each presentation. Cards and Ribbons/Rosettes will follow at the end of Judging.

All prizes offered and won will be given out on the day of the show. In the case of an objection to an award being lodged, such objections must be notified to the Show Secretary and any prizes will be withheld until matters are resolved.

The Club takes no responsibility for the loss of prizes at the Show.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THIS SHOW

- 1. This show is held under the Rules & By-Laws of the NZCF Inc. and the Hamilton Cat Club Inc. All Exhibitors are deemed to have agreed to abide by such rules. Copies of the Show Bylaws can be downloaded from the website www.nzcf.com.
- 2. **REFUNDS:** Upon written application to the Show Secretary, any exhibit may be withdrawn from any Show with full refunds prior to the show Entry closing date; and after that date with a possible forfeiture of part or all of the Club Entry Fee, and all payment of the Benching Fee due NZCF.
- 3. Entry Forms: Only the official entry form as adopted by the NZCF Inc. will be accepted for this show. If you are in doubt as to how to complete your entry form please contact the Show Secretary. If you require a receipt please enclose a stamped self-addressed envelope.
- 4. Exhibitors are responsible for entering their exhibits in the correct classes. Particulars entered on the entry form shall be identical to those given on the Registration or Transfer Certificate. If a kitten is owned by more than one owner the names of all the owners shall be given on all entry forms.
- 5. Only exhibits registered with the NZCF Inc. are eligible to enter the registered sections.
- 6. Exhibits MUST be presented at the venue in **CARRY CAGES** of ample size (<u>not on leads or in arms</u>) which must be left under each cat's benching cage during the show so that all cats could be evacuated speedily in case of emergency.

- 7. No exhibit shall be removed from the show before the scheduled closing time without the prior permission of the Show Manager or in their absence, the Show Secretary. (see form).
- 8. Vaccination Certificates: Vaccination certificates are required for all exhibits and must be presented to the Entry Clerk prior to benching certificates must be at least 7 days old.
- 9. All exhibits must have CLEAN EARS & COATS FREE FROM RINGWORM, MANGE & VERMIN.
- 10. Vetting will be In Cage as per Section 8 for the Show Bylaws (2018)
- 11. All exhibits shall be examined by a Veterinary Surgeon in the show hall. If in his/her written opinion any exhibit is not fit to remain in the show the exhibit shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the venue **IMMEDIATELY.** If so instructed other exhibits owned by the exhibitor must be removed from the venue. Veterinary decision shall be final. No entry fees will be refunded for any exhibit declared unfit on the day of the show. A vet rejection form is compulsory, including if the owner wants to 'withdraw' the cat/kitten.
- 12. No exhibitor shall exhibit a kitten which to his/her knowledge has, at the date of the show, been exposed to any infectious or contagious illness, disease, infection or contagious or parasitic illness or infection within a period of 21 clear days prior to the date of the show and NO kitten shall be exhibited if the exhibitor has had any such illness in his/her cattery during such period. If, in the opinion of the show committee, or any other person, an exhibitor is in breach of the above, such case shall be reported immediately, in writing to the National Secretary.
- 13. Entire male kittens without both testicles palpable beyond the stomach wall, or declawed kittens shall be disqualified by the Veterinary Surgeon.

14. <u>All</u> claws of each exhibit shall be clipped prior to judging.

- 15. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry at any time, fix or limit the number of entries, amend prize lists or use donations at their discretion.
- 16. Receipts and tallies will be available to each exhibitor prior to benching. No receipts will be issued prior to show day unless a SAE is supplied with entries. Cages (unless otherwise organized) and litter will be supplied by the Club.
- 17. No signs or decorations with your cattery or other distinguishing name will be allowed in or on cages until judging is completed.
- **18.** Colored curtains and bedding is allowed, plain white towels on top of cages are acceptable for judging purposes. A judge may by-pass any cage where the cage front restricts access to the cage.
- 19. Exhibits without bedding may not be judged (Show bylaws 10.5 & 10.6).
- 20. No Exhibitor has permission to sell cats or kittens on the day of the show within the confines of the hall or in the car park. A notice board will be provided.
- 21. The Club accepts no responsibility for exhibits or property, but will endeavor to see that all care is taken.
- 22. Please remember the principle of GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP, those behaving in an unseemly manner will be asked to vacate the venue.

Hamilton Cat Club Inc Guidelines for New Exhibitor's

For the love of Cats

Thank you for exhibiting at our show.

The show is designed to be a fun day for you where you will learn about what happens at a cat show.

Make sure you have entered your cat or kitten. Entries need to be completed and with the entry clerk by no later than 19 February.

Some useful tips - Before show preparation:

Groom your cat regularly as this will reduce the cat hair on the day and take out the summer and winter coats.

- A couple of days before the show give your cat a good groom, (different breeds require different grooming, if unsure about how to best care for your cat's coat, please ask.)
- Make sure ears, eyes and nose are all clean, wipe your cats bottom last. (Wipes are easy and less mess to use)
- Please clip your cats nails the night before show, all 4 paws.
- Make sure your cat is free from fleas
- On the morning of the show, give the cat a finial once over, check and wipe eyes.

This show is being held at the Gordonton Hall, 1024 Gordonton Road, Gordonton. You need to be there between 7.00am and 7.45am to bench your exhibit (Put it in its show cage).

Please bring your exhibit in a suitable carry cage (like the one you use when going to the vet). Also bring its vaccination certificate.

The exhibit will be in a show cage while you are at the show so it will need:

- Something to sit on (cushion, bed, blanket or towel).
- A small litter box in case it needs to go toilet during the day (HCC will supply the litter).
- You may like to also bring some water and a small container for it to have a drink.
- A few little treats or cat biscuits in case it gets hungry, ideally it is best to put these in the cage AFTER your exhibit has been judged.

The cages have wired sides so to make your exhibit feel more secure and relaxed you may like to decorate your cage with curtains (or a towel or fabric pegged or clipped or tied round the top) plus maybe a favorite toy.

You will be able to sit, watch and listen while your exhibit is being judged and it is a great opportunity to learn about this interesting hobby. While you are in the venue it is appreciated if you turn your cellphone to silent, as too much noise can often distract or upset the exhibits. Please do not use a flash when taking photos.

There will be food and drink on sale at the venue for when you get hungry and need something to eat, so bring some money for food and raffles.

This is planned to be a fun and interesting day. If you have any queries or questions, big or small, either on show day or before show day, or about entering please contact by phone or email any one of the following people - Bronwyn Main (Show Secretary) or Megan King (Assistant Show Manager).

We are here to help you. Best wishes and see you on 6th March, The team from Hamilton Cat Club.

REGISTERED COMPANION CATS

- 1. A Registered Companion Cat Section may be included in NZCF sanctioned Shows. The section may be judged by judges already contracted to judge another section at the same Show, including Domestic Judges.
- 2. All cats/kittens competing in the Companion Cat/Domestic Sections shall be de-sexed.
- 3. There will be two Divisions, Longhair and Shorthair, and cats and kittens will compete in their own sections within these Divisions.
- 4. The Registered Companion Cat Section will compete for titles, and cats having the necessary number of challenges will be known as Premier Companions, right up to Gold Double Grand Premier status.

i.e. Premier Companion Cats, Grand Premier Companion Cats, Double Grand Premier C Cs, Bronze Double Grand Premier C Cs, Silver Double Grand Premier C Cs, Gold Double Grand Premier C Cs.

- 5. Every cat placed in the Top 10 will be eligible for challenges, and 3 challenges from 3 different Judges are required before Premier Companion status is awarded (challenge certificates will be awarded only to cats in the top 10).
- 6. A cat which has been awarded challenges or other awards, and transfers into or out of the Registered Companion Cat section, cannot retain any awards or titles when so transferring.

As this Division is intended as a Division to enable pedigree, part pedigree, or pedigree phenotype cats to be shown specifically separate from unregistered Domestic exhibits, no cat which has been awarded Grand Champion or higher in either Entire or Neuter /Spay Divisions will be permitted to be shown as Registered Companion Cats

7. All cats and kittens entered in the Registered Companion Cat Section shall be entered under their registered name with the Prefix and breed number deleted from the Show Catalogue. The Show Catalogue must state the approximate age in years and months, and the Companion Cat registration number of the exhibit.

An unregistered cat or kitten when shown in the Companion Cat Division may be registered as a Companion Cat by its owner using its pet name.

- 8. A cat or kitten entered in the Domestic Section of a Show, which has some known pedigree, or has the phenotype or appearance of any pedigree cat, will be transferred from the Domestic Section to the Registered Companion Cat Section of that Show by the Show Secretary, with the registration number shown in the catalogue as "pending". The Show Secretary will notify the owner of the exhibit of such change before the start of the Show.
- 9. Should a cat or kitten entered in the Domestic Section of a Show be noticed on Show day to have the phenotype of a pedigree, then the terms of Clause 8 will apply.
- 10. On receipt of the marked catalogue, the Honours Registrar will initiate a registration number for any exhibit which has not previously had such granted, and will notify the new registration number to the owner of the exhibit. Registered Companion Cats registration numbers will have the prefix of CC, plus indication as to Longhair or Shorthair (CCL or CCS).
- 11. There will be no additional fees payable for registration of Registered Companion Cats, which may be initiated by the owner, the Show Secretary, or the Honours Registrar.
- 12. The Approved Standard for Registered Companion Cats is as follows:
 - [a] <u>General Physical Condition</u>: The cat should be in excellent health, with good coat condition. Battle scars are permissible provided they are clean.
 - [b] Grooming And Cleanliness: A high standard of grooming is a requirement with no sign of any dirt or other foreign matter. Eyes and ears must be clean.
 - [c] <u>Coat:</u> The coat colour and markings should be visually appealing, healthy and glossy, indicating good condition, with colour and markings melding to give an overall pleasing appearance.
 - [d] Temperament: No specific type, coat or breed standard is applicable. Excellent temperament is a major requirement.
 - [e] <u>Appearance:</u> The cat should be bright-eyed with an alert facial expression, with eye colour complementing the coat and pattern and colour. Overall, the cat should be visually appealing to the eye..


