Judges Profiles



ALEX MARINETS (TICA - CANADA)

Alex lives in the small town of Sechelt on the Sunshine Coast in British Columbia, Canada. She started to show cats in 2006 and bred Ragdolls under the cattery name Hugaragdoll. Later, she also bred Kurilian Bobtails and Chausies, showed British Shorthairs, Abyssinians, Chausies, American shorthairs, Kurilian Bobtails and other breeds in TICA. Alex had multiple International winning cats of her own breeding and had Best International Chausie alter in the world (TICA). Alex loved to clerk. She led the NW Regional Junior

Exhibitor program in TICA, and became a TICA mentor program coordinator. Alex started to judge cats in 2015 and is currently an Approved All breed judge in The International Cat Association.

Alex judges cats around the world and enjoys felines of all breeds. Outside the cat fancy she has worked for over 23 years for Kodak Graphics communications company as a technical support engineer. She spends her spare time with her husband Alexei, her dog Charlie and two cats – Peaches (Ragdoll bred by Alex which is 14.5 years old) and Bozman (a rescue cat which is 2 years old). Her favorite activities are hiking, paddle boarding, swimming and whale watching from the balcony of her home.



ALLAN RAYMOND (CFA - THAILAND)

I have been a cat lover all my life and in my early teens I always wanted to own a white cat. My dream was fulfilled when my music teacher's cat had a litter of all white kittens of which one was given to me much to my parent's disapproval.

As my teens progressed the family obtained a seal point Siamese and at another stage of my life I owned 2 Tonkinese.

My love affair with the official Cat World commenced in the 1970's in Tasmania when I purchased and successfully showed a blue Persian kitten in partnership with Michael Woods. This led to the purchase of other Persian colours and a very successful breeding and show career under the prefix "Raywood".

In 1980 a move to Melbourne, Victoria continued our breeding and showing and included an early dabble in exotics. We showed a Black

Persian Male who was FCCV Cat of the Year for 3 consecutive years. I also showed Oriental Shorthair successfully. In the early 1980's I commenced my judges training with the Feline Control Council of Victoria obtaining my Group 1 (Longhair) licence in 1985. 1990 I commenced my Group 3 training and continued that training with QFA Inc when we relocated to Surfers Paradise in Queensland. I became an All Breeds Judge in 1997.

I have had the honour of judging extensively throughout Australia and New Zealand and have also judged many times in Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, Belgium, France, Italy, Indonesia, Japan, USA, South Korea, South Africa, Hong Kong, England, Mainland China, Kuwait, Egypt and Taiwan.

I am honoured and humbled to have been accepted into the CFA Judges Program at the CFA Board meeting on 1 October 2011 after many years of guest judging for CFA. I was elevated to Approved All Breeds Judge in December 2012, the first Australian CFA USA All breeds judge.

I held the position of Vice-President of the QFA Inc for 7 years and an Executive Member of the Australian Cat Federation from 2003 until 2006 and held the position of ACF International Liaison Officer from 2003 until 2006. In the capacity of ILO I was the ACF Inc delegate at the World Cat Congress Conference in Houston Texas in 2004, Christchurch, New Zealand, 2005 and London, 2006.

In 2016 my partner, Michael Woods also an All Breeds Cat Judge, and I relocated to Thailand which we love and now call home.



DEBBIE CAMERON (ACF - AUSTRALIA)

Deborah Cameron NSW Australia- I have been in the cat fancy for some decades now and am an All Breeds Judge with close to 20 years experience as an international Judge and, Tutor for trainee judges. I showed and bred Persians of various varieties for many years and dabbled with my daughter with the smallest pedigree cat, the friendly Singapura. I have held various positions on different cat clubs, including state governing bodies, and provided expertise in writing government submissions regarding the Animal Companion Act.

I have vast experience in running cat shows including National Cat shows in Australia, enjoying the aspect of collaboration and teamwork.

NZCF Positions: I have been involved in an official capacity with NZCF for close to 50 years now and have held positions including those of Central Region Chairperson, National Vice Chairperson, Executive Council Secretary, World Cat Congress Delegate as International Liaison Officer for NZCF and All Breeds Tutor Judge. More recently having taken on the role of Provisional Registrar, Breed Standards Council. In 2010 I was honored with Life Membership of NZCF.

I entered the Longhair Judges Training Programme in 1981 extending my license to All Breeds in 1989. I still get a great deal of satisfaction out of continuing to be involved with the Training Programme as an All Breeds Tutor Judge.

I thoroughly enjoy the judging scene, the forward thinking of exhibitors working with improvement of their chosen breeds and of course the interaction with exhibitors and cat lovers from all walks of life.

I live with my cats in the quiet suburb of Cashmere in the hills of Christchurch, New Zealand.

I have been involved with animals all my life, bred, and exhibited Weimaraner's (German Hunting dog) in the Gundog ring to a level of National Champion. Initially a Devon Rex stole my heart at a cat show. Unfortunately, at that time the mopathy problem was being controlled

Separate Top Ten placings will still be submitted to NZCF for National Awards and Titles.

Supreme Awards are calculated as follows:
10 points for BIS; 9 points for R/U BIS etc. Eligible exhibits **MUST** have won at least one BIS.
Supreme exhibits will be decided by a judge's panel of one or more judges as follows:

- Top points scoring LH Entire cat & kitten, LH N/S cat & kitten (= supreme LH)
- Top points scoring SH Entire cat & kitten, SH N/S cat & kitten (= supreme SH)
- Top points scoring LH Dom, SH Dom, LH Com, SH Com (= supreme Dom/Com)

All Supreme winners MUST be photographed.

All other exhibits must be available for photography if required.

There may also be a photographer on the show floor at any time during the show – by submitting your entries you consent that there is a chance you or your cats may be photographed

***** Notes For Exhibitors *****

CAGES

Cages will NOT BE PROVIDED automatically.

You may hire a cage for \$10 per show day.

Hire cage dimensions are 76cm wide x 50cm deep x 50cm high.

The club's new cages are larger than the previous club cages, so you may need to have larger cage curtains and cushions.

The club's new cages are the black wire cages and have NO solid back or sides.

We will provide loose dividers to place between the CABCC cage SIDES.

Exhibitors are encouraged to use their own cages.

You may bring your cages to the show on Show morning.

You will be allocated a space that fits a 76cm wide cage.

If your cage dimension is different and you need more space, you **MUST** indicate this on your entry form.

If you don't tell us you have a larger cage there may NOT be enough room in the show hall for us to change this on the day.

***** The Important Stuff *****

1. You must provide bedding for each of your exhibits. Coloured bedding and/or curtains may be used.
2. You may provide a white towel/mat on the top of your cage for judging. Please note that some judges will not use the towels, and this is at the judges' discretion.
3. Please provide a litter tray for your exhibits (small plastic container the size of a shoe box is ideal). Wood pellet litter will be provided by the club.
4. All exhibits must be well groomed, have clean ears, be free from parasites (e.g. ringworm, fleas, mange) and **MUST** have their claws trimmed. **PLEASE NOTE THAT FAILURE TO TRIM CLAWS MAY RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION**
5. Use of powders or aerosol sprays is prohibited in the show hall at all times.
6. The age restriction for showing is 4 calendar months.
7. The age restriction for displaying kittens is 3 calendar months. The show committee will grant permission to have cats/kittens on display at their discretion, and no reason need be given for refusal to allow cats/kittens to be on display.
8. ALL kittens (whether being shown or on display) must hold a current vaccination certificate, showing a minimum of TWO vaccinations with the most recent vaccination being dated at least seven (7) days prior to the show.
Please ensure you have your current vaccination certificate with you. Failure to present your kittens' vaccination certificates will result in disqualification of those exhibits.
9. A Veterinarian will examine all exhibits and display cats/kittens in their cages after Benching. Please wait until the vet has cleared your exhibit before leaving the Show Hall. The vet clearance will be clearly marked on your exhibits cage card – only cleared exhibits may remain in the Show Hall. If your cat/kitten is vetted out it **MUST** be removed from the show hall.
10. The committee may decline or accept any entry to the show, without giving any reason for such decision, and may at their discretion elect to accept any entry received after the stated closing date.
11. No refund of entry fees shall be given after close of entries. (NZCF Show Bylaw 4.6).
12. No refund of overpaid entries shall be given.
13. All exhibits must be brought to the show secured inside a carry cage, NOT on leashes or in open arms. Failure to comply may result in disqualification of ALL your exhibits.
14. Carry cages must be left under your exhibition cages to facilitate evacuation of cats in the event of an emergency.
15. Exhibits are not to be removed from the show without written permission from the show manager. If you need to leave early you must fill out the attached permission form (NZCF Show Bylaw 10.8). Forms may also be downloaded from the NZCF website. Removal of exhibits without permission may result in loss of all prizes and NZCF points.
16. Please note that there may be club photographers present who may take photographs of you and/or your exhibits during the show. Entering the show constitutes acceptance that these photographs may be used by the club.
17. **"For Sale" notices are NOT allowed on cages at any time** and NO cats or kittens may be sold on show day within the confines of the show.
Promotional material may be placed on cages only after ALL judging (including supreme judging) is completed.
18. Domestic and Companion cats and kittens must be **desexed**
19. NZCF Show Bylaws section 8: No exhibitor shall exhibit a cat/kitten which to their knowledge has been exposed to any infectious or contagious disease/illness/parasite within a period of 21 clear days prior to the date of, and no cat shall be exhibited if the exhibitor has had such illness in his or her cattery during such period.
When any infection or contagious feline illness occurs within a cattery or household, then for 21 clear days after no further outbreak occur, or until a veterinarian certifies in writing that such illness is no longer contagious, no cat from that cattery or household shall be sold or exhibited.
Exhibitors having a veterinary certificate providing clearance from a contagious or infectious illness shall present the original dated certificate (no older than 14 days) to the Show Manager
Failure to comply with any part of this bylaw may involve disqualification for owners and their cats for such a period as the NZCF National Executive may decide.
20. Female cats which are obviously in kitten or lactating, male cats without both testicles palpable beyond the abdominal wall, and cats which have been declawed or devoiced shall be disqualified by either Veterinarian or Judge

Removal of an exhibit before the show has been officially closed without the prior permission of the Show Manager or Show Secretary will result in the loss of all club awards and NZCF annual awards points and any title points.
