Judges Profiles



DENNIS GANOE – (CFA – OREGON, USA)

I first went to a cat show in the summer of 1987 as an assistant to carry cats into the show hall. At my first show I discovered the Korat and fell in love with the breed. I got my own cats that fall from a Korat breeder, Judy Buckle. Judy and I traveled to local shows as I learned more about cats and showing. On our way to a show, I proposed, and we married in 1990. During the next ten years, I learned to clerk, how to run a cat show and raised and exhibited Persians and Maine Coons in addition to Korats. I've also exhibited Orientals, Abyssinians, Scottish Folds, Exotics and Somali. I have since raised Bengals and LaPerms. Just this year we acquired

our first Khao Manee.

In 2000 I applied and was accepted into the CFA judging program, advancing through the ranks to become certified all breeds in 2007. I've recently celebrated my 23rd year as a CFA judge. I am the current Breed Council Secretary for LaPerms. I was elected to the CFA Board of Directors in 2013 serving for two years.

I've judged in Japan, Europe, Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia, and China under CFA rules. I've also judged in South Africa (under SACC rules) and Australia (under ACF rules). Everywhere I've traveled I have had the great pleasure to share my love of cats with like minded people. It continues to be a joy for me.



JANIS CHRISTISON (ACF - AUSTRALIA)

I have always been fascinated with cats and can clearly remember my first cat Josie, a grey tabby, my constant companion when I was a small child. I entered the cat fancy in Canberra in 1976 showing a Persian neuter. My prefix Santique (in partnership with my husband) was granted the same year in Canberra and I bred blue, cream and blue-cream Persians for many years until moving 'home' to Queensland in 1989. In 1991 I began an Exotic programme from first generation breeding in most colours and patterns but always on a small scale. Many major awards were achieved over the years including Group 1 Cat of Year awards in 1987, 1990 and 1998, each time with a blue Persian! We no longer have entire cats having dedicated the many years since the last litter in 2000 to caring for our retired show and breeding cats which have now all sadly passed on. We now give all our love and care to our young neuters, an Exotic and a Russian, which have brought me back to

the fun of showing – both have won Desexed Cat of Year.

I am an ACF Inc All Breeds International Judge and have been judging since 1991. I regularly judge all over Australia and New Zealand and I have also judged in Germany, the Netherlands, Malaysia, Sweden and South Africa. It is always a pleasure and a privilege to handle so many beautiful felines and meet their proud owners.

I am currently President of Queensland Feline Association Inc (QFA), a position I previously held during 2015–2017 following my service as a Vice President from 2005. I have been a Tutor Judge since 1999 and have always been very involved at Club level especially in the position of show manager.



WENDY HAMILTON (ACF - AUSTRALIA)

My first purebred cat was a wonderful seal point Siamese but after a visit to a cat show I fell in love with the Burmese, purchased my first breeding girl and registered my Zarlee prefix the same year, while still a teenager. I exhibited and bred Burmese of all colours, winning Best in Show a number of times for 10 years, however it was during this time I saw my first Birman cat at Sydney Town Hall cat show and I was hooked! So it was in 1982 that a Seal Point Birman joined my family, followed by a number of imports (UK, Sweden, NZ) for my passion of chocolate cats! I achieved Best in Show awards with my Birmans both here and with exports. It was during my trips to the continent that I discovered the beauty of the Fife Oriental and in 2011 I added the most divine Hungarian bi-colour to my

Home and you guessed it, a chocolate and white. Then followed a beautiful Austrian black tabby and white Oriental girl plus a locally grown tabby point Siamese. I went full circle. All are now retired pets and much loved companions.

I became a CCCA judge in 1999 (G1), G2 in 2003 and finished to All Breed in 2010. I am a Life member of the Birman Cat Club of Australasia Inc after serving as President and Show Manager for over a decade. I have been an active Cat Fancy member, presented at many CCCA Judges Conferences, and Chaired a G1 Judges Training course for NSWCFCA, sat on Breed Standard Committees as well as an Association committee and President.

I consider myself fortunate to have judged around most of Australia and New Zealand as well as in France, Belgium and Netherlands. In this time I have been privileged to handle so many beautiful felines.



MICHELLE MAGRATH (NZCF – NEW PLYMOUTH)

The best cat in the show is the one cat that each exhibitor takes home at the end of the day, as every cat is special, they each deserve the same care, consideration and attention.

I believe it is important to produce a professional result for the club and contribute to the show's success and enjoyment by exhibitors and spectators. Shows should be fun: entertaining, educational and interesting.

I have always had a passion for animals, particularly of the feline and equine variety, I have bred and raised horses of various breeds, Siamese and Oriental cats

From a young age I have had a passion for animals of all shapes and sizes. As a young adult I bred and showed German Shepherds until the children came along and dominated my time with things like BMX and other sports. I am now a mother of 4 children and grandmother of 8. I purchased my first Birman in 2003 and started breeding under my prefix "Belzicatz". I live in New Plymouth with my husband Geoff and my lovely fur babies.

Since I started breeding I have also been very involved in the "Cat World" and have been the Treasurer of Taranaki Cat Club and also The Sacred Temple Cat Club for many years now, and have also been show secretary/manager for many shows. Separate Top Ten placings will still be submitted to NZCF for National Awards and Titles.

Supreme Awards are calculated as follows:

10 points for BIS; 9 points for R/U BIS etc. Eligible exhibits **MUST** have won at least one BIS.
The Top Longhair and Top Shorthair in each division will be judged off against one another for Supreme in each division.

Top points scoring Entire Cat (= Supreme Entire Cat)
Top points scoring Entire Kitten (= Supreme Entire Kitten)
Top Points scoring Neuter/Spay Cat (= Supreme Neuter/Spay Cat)
Top Points Scoring Neuter Spay Kitten (= Supreme Neuter/Spay Kitten)
Top points scoring LH Dom, SH Dom, LH Com, SH Com (= Supreme Dom/Com)

All Supreme winners MUST be photographed.

All other exhibits must be available for photography if required.

There may also be a photographer on the show floor at any time during the show – by submitting your entries you consent that there is a chance you or your cats may be photographed

CAGES

Cages will NOT BE PROVIDED automatically.

You may hire a cage for \$10 per show day.

Hire cage dimensions are 76cm wide x 50cm deep x 50cm high.

The club's new cages are larger than the previous club cages, so you may need to have larger cage curtains and cushions.

The club's new cages are the black wire cages and have NO solid back or sides.

We will provide loose dividers to place between the CABCC cage SIDES.

Exhibitors are encouraged to use their own cages.

You may bring your cages to the show on Show morning.

You will be allocated a space that fits a 76cm wide cage.

If your cage dimension is different and you need more space, you MUST indicate this on your entry form.

If you don't tell us you have a larger cage there may NOT be enough room in the show hall for us to change this on the day.

******* The Important Stuff *******

1. You must provide bedding for each of your exhibits. Coloured bedding and/or curtains may be used.
2. You may provide a white towel/mat on the top of your cage for judging. Please note that some judges will not use the towels, and this is at the judges' discretion.
3. Please provide a litter tray for your exhibits (small plastic container the size of a shoe box is ideal). Wood pellet litter will be provided by the club.
4. All exhibits must be well groomed, have clean ears, be free from parasites (e.g. ringworm, fleas, mange) and MUST have their claws trimmed. **PLEASE NOTE THAT FAILURE TO TRIM CLAWS MAY RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION**
5. Use of powders or aerosol sprays is prohibited in the show hall at all times.
6. The age restriction for showing is 4 calendar months.
7. The age restriction for displaying kittens is 3 calendar months. The show committee will grant permission to have cats/kittens on display at their discretion, and no reason need be given for refusal to allow cats/kittens to be on display.
8. ALL kittens (whether being shown or on display) must hold a current vaccination certificate, showing a minimum of TWO vaccinations with the most recent vaccination being dated at least 48 hours prior to the show. (Show By-Law -4.11)
Please ensure you have your current vaccination certificate with you. Failure to present your kittens' vaccination certificates will result in disqualification of those exhibits.
9. A Veterinarian will examine all exhibits and display cats/kittens in their cages after Benching. Please wait until the vet has cleared your exhibit before leaving the Show Hall. The vet clearance will be clearly marked on your exhibits cage card – only cleared exhibits may remain in the Show Hall. If your cat/kitten is vetted out it MUST be removed from the show hall.
10. The committee may decline or accept any entry to the show, without giving any reason for such decision, and may at their discretion elect to accept any entry received after the stated closing date.
11. No refund of entry fees shall be given after close of entries. (NZCF Show Bylaw 4.6).
12. No refund of overpaid entries shall be given.
13. All exhibits must be brought to the show secured inside a carry cage, NOT on leashes or in open arms. Failure to comply may result in disqualification of ALL your exhibits.
14. Carry cages must be left under your exhibition cages to facilitate evacuation of cats in the event of an emergency.
15. Exhibits are not to be removed from the show without written permission from the show manager. If you need to leave early you must fill out the attached permission form (NZCF Show Bylaw 10.8). Forms may also be downloaded from the NZCF website. Removal of exhibits without permission may result in loss of all prizes and NZCF points.
16. Please note that there may be club photographers present who may take photographs of you and/or your exhibits during the show. Entering the show constitutes acceptance that these photographs may be used by the club.
17. **"For Sale" notices are NOT allowed on cages at any time** and NO cats or kittens may be sold on show day within the confines of the show.
Promotional material may be placed on cages only after ALL judging (including supreme judging) is completed.
18. Domestic and Companion cats and kittens must be **desexed**
19. NZCF Show Bylaws section 8: No exhibitor shall exhibit a cat/kitten which to their knowledge has been exposed to any infectious or contagious disease/illness/parasite within a period of 21 clear days prior to the date of, and no cat shall be exhibited if the exhibitor has had such illness in his or her cattery during such period.

When any infection or contagious feline illness occurs within a cattery or household, then for 21 clear days after no further outbreak occur, or until a veterinarian certifies in writing that such illness is no longer contagious, no cat from that cattery or household shall be sold or exhibited.
Exhibitors having a veterinary certificate providing clearance from a contagious or infectious illness shall present the original dated certificate (no older than 14 days) to the Show Manager
Failure to comply with any part of this bylaw may involve disqualification for owners and their cats for such a period as the NZCF National Executive may decide.
20. Female cats which are obviously in kitten or lactating, male cats without both testicles palpable beyond the abdominal wall, and cats which have been declawed or devoiced shall be disqualified by either Veterinarian or Judge
